# Who is being asked to take part, and why?

There is not much research about primary school teachers. I am sending a request to full time primary school teachers. Some of these teachers will have affiliation with APL Health, but it does not matter to the research if you don't.

### What will I be asked to do?

You will be asked to respond to an on-line survey about your work (for example, your workload, changes at work, support available to you at work) and wellbeing. It takes about 15 minutes to complete. There are 59 short questions, with 'tick box' answers. The questionnaire is anonymous. It does not ask for your name or school.

You are free to withdraw at any point before or during the study. Withdrawal does not require a reason. Because this questionnaire is anonymous, once you have completed and submitted the questionnaire it is not possible to withdraw the data because we won't know who you are.

# Will the research be of any personal benefit to me?

No – but I hope it will be of interest to you and to managers in schools.

### What will happen to the information I provide?

The raw data will be only viewed by myself and my supervisor and not shared with any third parties including. Once I have analysed and summarised the data, and my research project is completed, the data will be kept securely at the University of Nottingham.

If you would like to know the results of this study, a summary of the results, will be made available on the APL Health client area later in the year. I will also give this summary to my managers at APL Health. It is possible that the results might be published in a journal.
